Facilitators

Each year, facilitators are required to complete an orientation which includes:

- OH&S Regulations
- Audiovisual recording system
- Manikin orientation - if applicable
- Consent and Release forms
- Changes to Simulation Centre processes or procedures

We offer numerous pre-scheduled facilitator orientation sessions at the beginning of the academic year to accommodate a variety of teaching schedules and offer more throughout the year as required.

New facilitators are also required to complete the Simulation Facilitator Resources course.

Participants

Each academic year participants are required to complete an orientation which includes:

- Live (or online) participant orientation
- Manikin orientation - if applicable
- Confidentiality & Consent and Release forms

The Simulation Center creates real life environments where participants integrate their skills and knowledge to perform in a scenario they may encounter in healthcare and other environments. The simulation attempts to engage a variety of senses to prepare them for real world experiences. The Simulation Centre enhances realism to promote physiological engagement, but if participants feel psychologically unsafe or overwhelmed, they can remove themselves from the simulation. Participants can be assisted by counselling services as required.

Facilitator and participant orientations provide information on how to work safely in a simulated environment and how to respond in emergent situations.
