What is a Letter of Invitation

A letter written by you that invites your family to visit Canada. This letter can be used to support your family's temporary resident applications and entry into Canada. You can find details about what information should be included in your Letter of Invitation here.

Some Visa Offices require that Letters of Invitation be notarized.

A Letter of Invitation does not guarantee that your family's temporary resident applications with be approved.

Why Write a Letter of Invitation

There are several reasons why you may want to invite your family to visit Canada.

If you want to	Supporting documents that you can give to your family to include in their applications
a) invite your family to visit you	 Letter of Invitation (written by you) Copy of your passport Copy of your study permit (should be valid for the duration of your family's proposed visit) Confirmation of Enrollment Letter (mynait.nait.ca > Open Self-Services > Manage Classes > Confirmation of Enrolment).
b) invite your family to Convocation	 Letter of Invitation (written by you) Copy of your passport Copy of your study permit (should be valid for the duration of your family's proposed visit) Confirmation of Enrollment Letter (mynait.nait.ca > Open Self-Services > Manage Classes > Confirmation of Enrolment). Proposed Confirmation of Graduation Letter with Convocation dates (requested through www.nait.ca/help).

How to Format your Letter of Invitation

When writing a formal letter, it is important to be clear and concise. The style of writing a formal letter is standardized within Canada. The following details are required when writing a Letter of Invitation:

- Date
- Address and Name of Recipient
- Subject topic of the letter
- Body of Letter Information that you would like to explain
- Closing and your information Name, Address, Phone Number

Ensure your Letter of Invitation is honest and use your own words when writing it. The example below may vary from your letter both in terms of content and length.
