Appeals for Academic Misconduct will be granted by the Academic Integrity Liaison (or Designate) if one of the following conditions is demonstrated by the student, based on a balance of probabilities:

1. The decision or Sanction was demonstrably biased.
Students must provide evidence to support why they believe the decision or Sanction was biased.
2. New information has become available that would change the outcome of the case.
This means that the decision was made prior to the information being received. This does not include if the Student has withheld information from the decision maker.
3. The appropriate process was not followed, was demonstrably unfair, or flawed.
This means that policy/procedure was not followed in rendering a decision or imposing a Sanction
